

Credit Hours/Financial Aid

Minimum enrollment required to be eligible for Federal financial aid:

- Fall and Spring terms (August and January)
 at least 4.5 credit hours
- Summer term (May) at least 1.5 credit hours

How does it work?




The Class Schedule has a list view and a schedule view for all terms.



Transfer Credit	Course Exemptions	
Based upon <u>Graduate</u> courses completed at another University, within the past 5 years, and with grades of B or better. Pass/Fail courses are NOT transferable.	Based upon courses completed with comparable content and competencies, typically within a BSPH or another MPH program.	
Can request transfer credit for Core, Concentration, and/or Elective courses.	Course Exemptions are ONLY available for SPHG 711 & 712. No other courses are eligible for exemption.	
Results in earned credits toward degree completion.	Does NOT result in earned credits towards degree completion and exempted course credits must still be earned.

This is the ideal option for <u>students who will receive Federal Financial Aid</u> and/or want to ease into the program.

Term 1 will NOT meet minimum requirements for Federal Financial Aid in Fall or Spring terms. Terms 2 & 3 will meet minimum requirements for Federal Financial Aid in all terms.

Note: This option is not required; you do not "sign up" for any registration option and can change the number of credits you take each term. Regularly consult with your Academic Coordinator about academic planning that best meets your needs.

This option is <u>not</u> recommended for students who have been out of school a while, are working full time, or do not have ample time to study. Taking SPHG 711, 712, & 713 concurrently will be very challenging for any student, especially students that do not have a quantitative mathematical background.



Approval from MPH practicum team to begin hours

Practicum Requirements*



Be an applied public health practice experience the purpose of which is to contribute to improvements in public health at the population rather than individual level.



Take place in partnership with a governmental, non-governmental, non-profit, industrial, for-profit, or appropriate university-affiliated organization.



Allow for application of graduate-level public health skills.



Yield 2 products that demonstrate 5 competencies.



Be mentored by a supervisor (preceptor) with public health expertise and experience.



Be located within an area approved for University-affiliated travel.



Comprise a minimum of 200 hours.




